Dear Parents,

This term seems to have flown by and how action packed it has been too.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for all the support you have shown to the school over what can only be described as a challenging term. In light of the government guidance allowing households to mix over the festive period we hope that you have the opportunity to enjoy time with loved ones.

Although we have been restricted, Christmas has certainly been celebrated at Fir Tree nonetheless! This week has seen delicious Christmas Dinners within our bubbles and the Panto came to us this year, oh yes it did! What a lovely way to end the term. I wanted to share with you our school Christmas Tree too; Miss Hayter organized an Art project for every child to decorate a peg for the tree – doesn't it

look stunning! These are on their way home to you today!

I cannot thank yourselves, the staff and the children enough for everything we have accomplished this term and how we have pulled



together as a community. I am incredibly proud to be Headteacher at Fir Tree and we have shown that we have clear systems, routines and communication in place that has enabled our children to still

work to a very high standard with minimal disruption.

One area which I think we could refocus on over the next few weeks is the times in which your children are being dropped off in the mornings. Children without siblings in the school should enter their allocated school gate a couple of minutes before their scheduled start time and not before.

This keeps bubbles separated and minimises the risk of spreading which could result in multiple bubbles having to be sent home. Those with more than one child attending school should ensure that they too are not dropping off too early from their child's earliest class start time.

Whilst being late shouldn't occur anyway – this also can increase the risk of bubbles mixing, so being punctual is as important as ever.

- Yrs R/5 8:40am (not on site/gate before 8:35am)
- Yrs 1/3 8:50am (not on site before 8:45am)
- **Yr 4** 9:00am (not on site before 8:55am)

Secondly, we spend all day keeping children separated in bubbles during the school day – please on coming to and leaving school can you ensure that your children stay with you (preferably 2 metres away from the people in front of you) and don't run ahead where they suddenly become close to children from other classes.

Hopefully it won't be necessary, however if you need to notify us of a positive result for your child for Covid-19, that occurs before 19<sup>th</sup> December, then please email the office to office@firtree.newburyacademytrust.org

Finally, I'd ask parents to be aware of the need to stay 2m apart from other parents on leaving the school, it is important that we all follow the guidance in order to stop the spread of the virus. Thanks again for all your support in keeping the school a safe environment for children, parents and staff.

## **Holidays During the Christmas Period**

I recently asked the Local
Authority for guidance on parents
travelling abroad during holiday time and
subsequently not attending school through
quarantining. If parents travel abroad to a
country knowing that they have to selfisolate on their return and that this will
cause their child to have a further two
weeks off school, then the school might
want to consider a Fixed Penalty Notice as
they (the parents) are knowingly making

that decision.

As parents will not have made an absence request to the school, as the holiday is not during term time, I am currently unaware of any children who may miss school due to the scenario above. On return of such a trip abroad, where quarantining for two weeks will be necessary, I am happy to meet with parents to ascertain more context before deciding on whether to proceed with a request for a Fixed Penalty Notice.

#### **National Assessments**

Every year there are various national assessments that the children across the school are required to sit. Never has it been more important to assess the impact of COVID 19 on education, as a

result there has been some changes this year with KS1 SATs being cancelled; Year 6 will only be tested in Maths and Reading and Year 4's Multiplication Check will be optional. The dates below are when these are taking place.

- Year 1 Phonic Assessment Week Beginning 7th June 2021
- Year 4 MTC (Multiplication Times Table Check) Week Beginning 7<sup>th</sup> June 2021
- Year 6 SATS Week Beginning 10th May 2020

Information about these assessments will be shared over the coming months, where the class teachers will explain the

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arrangements in more detail and how you can support your child. Please pencil the dates from the calendar now into your diaries.

This term's tips to share with you that we are working on in EYFS to develop children's speech and their language in order for them to listen, learn and progress that you too could employ at home to support your child's development are as follows:



#### **Talking Tips**

- Reduce background noise: Turn off the television when playing and talking together. This will help your child to learn to listen.
- Don't let your child speak with a dummy in their mouth: The dummy will get in the way of talking.
- Enjoy songs and nursery rhymes together:
   Especially ones with lots of actions and repetition.
- Slow down your rate of speech: This will give your child more time to think about what you have said.
