Dear Parents and Carers

It is important that they can socialise with their friends in school and that our younger pupils continue to develop their communication and language skills, this will be a school priority for Fir Tree

Today saw the focus on Comic Relief and in particular making others smile and spreading some cheer. At Fir Tree as you know, each class identified their class superpower and challenged it to




### Wellbeing top tip of the week

Making someone smile can be one of the best gifts we can give.





Thank you to everyone who completed our return to school/wellbeing survey. This was really well received and returned. In school we are working through your comments and observations to ensure that your child/ren are supported.



As we have mentioned we are settling back in to school, and recovery will take some time. A whole school focus for us at Fir Tree in **ORACY**. It is through talk that children have the opportunity to develop and share their understanding, through interactions with families, teachers and peers. Oracy helps support children to build successful relationships, talk through issues, express feelings and resolve conflicts. Taking the time to talk to your children and playing games with them regularly will support them with this a long with:

- developing their speech and their language
- enabling them to listen, learn and progress
- making them feel supported and lessen anxiety
- identifying any barriers or concerns



The Children's Wellbeing Service are aware that many parents have struggled with their child's sleep during lockdown and still are, they have produced four videos all about how parents can support their children to get a better night's sleep. The videos are all relatively short (between 7 and 12 mins long), and
