Dear Parents/Guardians,








Jay made a nature crown on no screen day in Reception - it looks lovely Jay!

Y1 have started to work on Traditional Tales, they have been retelling stories orally and made stick puppets to act out the story of the Three Little Pigs - looks like great fun!
















Penny in Year 5 made a stunning journey stick for non-screen day - you should be very proud of this Penny!




